Don't miss kickoff when Friel shares her experiences at the NFL, and discusses how domestic violence, child abuse and sexual misconduct, once the exclusive domain of prosecutors, became a private sector problem and how the handling of these matters has evolved. After viewing masterpieces by Vermeer, Rembrandt, Velázguez, and other old masters, you will see the major spring exhibition, Van Dyck: The Anatomy of Portraiture, and then join your hosts at their nearby apartment for a reception to compare notes.
