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Jenna Sciabica, by and through her attorneys, The Behrins Law Firm, for her Complaint against the above named defendants, alleges on knowledge as to her own actions, and otherwise upon information and belief, as follows:

PRELIMINARY STATEMENT

1. This is a civil rights action brought under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and the New Jersey Civil Rights Act to vindicate Jenna Sciabica's Constitutional rights and redress the devastating consequences of false, fabricated accusations that have destroyed an exemplary 16-year teaching career built on dedication, compassion, and meaningful impact on countless students' lives.
2. For sixteen years, Jenna Sciabica ("Plaintiff" or "Sciabica") served as a beloved special education teacher in the Marlboro Township Public Schools, working tirelessly to provide exceptional education to students with learning disabilities. She pioneered the implementation of the Wilson Reading System curriculum in Marlboro, transforming the lives of struggling students and earning the profound gratitude of families throughout the district. Sciabica was a tenured teacher with an unblemished record—no complaints, no disciplinary actions, no negative evaluations—until opportunistic parents and their attorney orchestrated a campaign of false accusations in a transparent attempt to extract millions of dollars from the School District.
3. The destruction of Sciabica's career began with a brief, innocent interaction in a school hallway on March 13, 2024, involving a playful reference to a dance dress fitting that had occurred the previous week in the presence of the student's mother—which was deliberately distorted, fabricated, and weaponized by individuals seeking financial gain at the expense of an innocent teacher's life and livelihood.
4. As a direct result of Defendants' campaign of defamation and Constitutional violations, Sciabica has been forced to resign twice, lost her tenure and pension benefits, threatening her financial security, received credible death threats and bomb threats, and was publicly branded a "predator," "groomer," and "pedophile" throughout her community and beyond. This devastating personal and professional

destruction occurred during the most vulnerable period of Sciabica's life—just months after her life partner, Anthony Alfano died following a courageous five-year battle with cancer.

5. Tragically, the lawsuit destroying Sciabica's life was initiated by a parent she had considered a dear friend—someone who had repeatedly expressed profound gratitude for Sciabica's dedication to her daughter's education, who had encouraged and facilitated Sciabica's mentoring relationship with her child, and who had provided emotional support during Anthony's illness and death. This betrayal adds a particularly cruel dimension to the already unconscionable conduct that has robbed Sciabica of her career, reputation, financial security, and mental health.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

6. This Court has jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331, as this action arises under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and the Constitution and laws of the United States.
7. This Court has supplemental jurisdiction over the state law claims pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1367.
8. Venue is proper under 28 U.S.C. § 1391(b)(2), as a substantial part of the events giving rise to this action occurred within this judicial district.

PARTIES

9. Plaintiff Jenna Sciabica is a resident and citizen of New Jersey who served as a special education teacher in the Marlboro Township Public Schools from 2008 until her forced resignation in 2024.
10. Defendant Marlboro Township Public Schools is a public school district organized under New Jersey law, operating schools within Marlboro Township, and subject to suit under 42 U.S.C. § 1983.
11. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Michael Ballone is the Superintendent of Marlboro Township Public Schools, sued in his official capacity.
12. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant John Pacifico is the Principal of Marlboro Memorial Middle School, sued in his official capacity.

13. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Loreen Labuza is the Vice-Principal of Marlboro Township Public Schools, sued in her official capacity.
14. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Michael J. Gross, Esq. is Counsel for Marlboro Township Public Schools, sued in his official capacity.
15. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Vincent Caravello is Business Administrator for Marlboro Township Public Schools, sued in his official capacity.
16. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Christine Jelinsky is Assistant Business Administrator for Marlboro Township Schools, sued in her official capacity.
17. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Michaela Weir is an employee of Marlboro Township Public Schools who participated in the events giving rise to this lawsuit.
18. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Township of Marlboro is a municipal corporation and a state-created governmental organization and is subject to suit under 42 U.S.C. § 1983.
19. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendants John Does Nos. 1-10 and Jane Roes Nos. 1-10 are currently unknown and unnamed individuals employed by the Township of Marlboro, sued in their official capacities as Police Officers and/or employees of the Township of Marlboro.
20. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Pasquale Menna is a municipal prosecutor for Marlboro Township with a work address of 151 Bodman Place, Suite 300, Red Bank, New Jersey, sued in his individual and official capacities.
21. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendants Wendi Turturici and Salvatore Turturici reside in Marlboro Township, New Jersey.
22. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendants Angela Boyd McNicholas, Evelyn Arminio Bilotti, Carolina Scalici, Ereny Phillips Tadros, Michelle Stoylar, Nicole Stouffer, Susan Rae Gleeson, Bonnie Gabizon, Laurie Swanson, Rita Ienco Plaza, Nicole Gwasda, and Irene Dekhterman are individuals who participated in the defamation campaign against Sciabica through social media and other public fora.

23. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Nima Ameri, Esq. is an attorney representing the Turturici family who made false and defamatory statements about Sciabica in public fora and in the news media.
24. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendant Nicole Tropiano is a resident of the State of New Jersey and maliciously defamed the Plaintiff after she was acquitted at trial.
25. At all times relevant to this complaint, Gary Smiley is a resident of the State of New Jersey and maliciously defamed the Plaintiff after she was acquitted at trial.
26. At all times relevant to this complaint, Mark Henley is a resident of the State of New Jersey and maliciously defamed the Plaintiff after she was acquitted at trial.
27. At all times relevant to this complaint, Defendants State Farm Fire and Casualty Company and its wholly owned subsidiary, Republic-Franklin Insurance Company, are insurance companies that wrongfully denied coverage to Sciabica despite contractual obligations to defend and indemnify her.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS
Sciabica's Exemplary Teaching Career

28. From 2008 to 2024, Jenna Sciabica dedicated her professional life to serving students with special needs in the Marlboro Township Public Schools, earning recognition as an exceptional educator who transformed lives through her innovative teaching methods and unwavering commitment to student success.
29. Sciabica was instrumental in introducing the Wilson Reading System to Marlboro Township, a specialized curriculum designed to help students with dyslexia and other reading difficulties. Her expertise in this system made her an invaluable resource for struggling students throughout the district.
30. Sciabica was the only teacher in Marlboro Township Public Schools with Level II Wilson certification. Defendants' acts to force Sciabica out of her highly specialized position denied struggling readers with language disabilities an educational resource that no other teachers in the district were qualified or licensed to provide.

31. Throughout her career, Sciabica maintained an unblemished professional record with no complaints, disciplinary actions, or negative evaluations. She was beloved by colleagues, students, and parents alike for her dedication, compassion, and effectiveness as an educator.
32. Sciabica earned tenure through her exemplary service and was considered a vital asset to the special education program at Marlboro Memorial Middle School.

The Development of a Close Family Friendship

33. L.T. was assigned to Sciabica's special education class due to reading and short-term memory challenges that necessitated additional academic support. L.T. attended Sciabica's class two to three days per week for specialized instruction.
34. During her work with L.T., Sciabica observed symptoms that concerned her and contacted Wendi Turturici to share her observations. Sciabica's vigilance led to the identification of L.T.'s previously undiagnosed seizure disorder, prompting immediate medical intervention that may have prevented serious harm to the child.
35. Wendi Turturici was so grateful for Sciabica's intervention, writing: "Sciabica -- I almost don't have the words to express our gratitude for your noticing something was wrong and contacted me (sic) immediately. Without you I would not have known, and this situation could have been so much worse, [L.T.] could have had a massive seizure and well who knows what from there...I am so grateful for your love and kindness and love you have shown to [L.T.]. I wish every teacher had just a little bit of you in them...the world would be such a better place!"
36. Sciabica's intervention cemented a relationship built on trust, gratitude, and mutual respect between Sciabica and L.T.'s family, leading to an extended friendship that would last for three years prior to the incident at issue.
37. Through these regular visits and interactions, Sciabica developed a close friendship with Wendi Turturici characterized by frequent communication, shared humor, and mutual support during challenging times.

38. The two women regularly exchanged text messages, memes, TikTok videos, and personal information. They shared an irreverent, sometimes crude sense of humor that included discussions of topics that might seem inappropriate to outsiders but were perfectly normal within the context of their friendship.
39. Wendi Turturici frequently used inappropriate language in her home and around her children, creating an environment where casual, sometimes crude humor was the norm. This context is crucial to understanding the innocent nature of subsequent interactions that have been deliberately misconstrued.
40. Wendi Turturici regularly confided in Sciabica about personal family matters, marital issues, and other intimate details of her life, demonstrating the depth of trust and friendship between them.

Support During Personal Tragedy

41. When Sciabica's life partner was diagnosed with cancer, L.T.'s family provided substantial emotional support throughout his five-year battle with the disease.
42. Wendi Turturici drove Sciabica to medical appointments in New York City, helped with practical matters during Anthony's illness, and provided consistent emotional support during this particularly difficult period.
43. Wendi Turturici frequently checked on Sciabica during Anthony's illness, offering comfort and practical assistance whenever needed.
44. On September 4, 2023, Sciabica informed Wendi Turturici that Anthony had died the previous evening after his courageous battle with cancer.
45. Wendi Turturici immediately offered support, stating: "I'm thinking about you today...hang on [that] you have a lot of friends that love and support you...pls call me anytime" and "please remember that we love you a lot. You've been very heavy on our minds and we are here for you."
46. Wendi Turturici called Sciabica on her birthday to sing "Happy Birthday" to her, demonstrating the continued closeness of their friendship even after Anthony's death.

47. As a gesture of friendship and to help Sciabica during her period of grief, L.T.'s family accepted furniture and other household items that held painful memories for Sciabica. Ironically, the family continues to use this furniture in their home despite now claiming that L.T. is "triggered" by the mere mention of Sciabica's name.

Wendi Turturici's Pattern of Litigiousness

48. Throughout her relationship with the Marlboro Township Public Schools, Wendi Turturici demonstrated a pattern of intimidation by threatening litigation and seeking financial compensation for various perceived grievances.
49. Wendi Turturici frequently made aggressive statements about the school district, declaring herself to be in "ready to kill mode" and "out for war" when she disagreed with school policies or decisions.
50. She actively sought legal representation for multiple disputes with the school district, demonstrating a clear pattern of using litigation as a primary means of resolving conflicts.
51. Upon information and belief, Wendi Turturici has been involved in multiple lawsuits prior to the current allegations against Sciabica, establishing a clear pattern of litigiousness for financial gain.
52. This history of aggressive legal action and financial demands provides crucial context for understanding the motivation behind the current false accusations against Sciabica.

The Mentoring Relationship with L.T.

53. Through her close friendship with Wendi Turturici and her role as L.T.'s teacher, Sciabica developed a mentoring relationship with L.T. that was not only known to but actively encouraged by L.T.'s parents.
54. Sciabica viewed L.T. as if she were her own daughter or niece, providing guidance, encouragement, and support with the full knowledge and approval of L.T.'s parents.
55. There was absolutely nothing sexual, inappropriate, or improper about this mentoring relationship, and any suggestion to the contrary is false, defamatory, and deeply offensive.

56. Sciabica occasionally communicated with L.T. via text message, but always with the knowledge and explicit approval of Wendi Turturici. The content of these communications was entirely appropriate and consistent with a normal mentoring relationship.
57. Over the course of nearly three years, Sciabica sent approximately 50 individual text messages to L.T., a remarkably modest amount of communication that belies any suggestion of inappropriate contact.
58. Many of the allegedly “inappropriate” communications attributed to Sciabica and L.T. were actually exchanges between Sciabica and Wendi Turturici, further demonstrating the deliberate distortion of facts by those seeking to harm Sciabica.
59. L.T.’s own text messages to Sciabica included statements such as “this is what mom wanted me to show you” and “my mom is going to call you from my phone,” clearly demonstrating that all communications were conducted with parental knowledge and approval.

The March 5, 2024 Dress Fitting Context

60. On March 5, 2024, one week before the alleged “incident” that would destroy Sciabica's life, Wendi Turturici repeatedly requested that Sciabica help L.T. try on her dance dress to ensure proper fit for an upcoming performance.
61. At Wendi Turturici’s insistence, Sciabica assisted L.T. with the dress fitting in the family’s home, with Wendi Turturici present and actively participating in the process.
62. When it became apparent that the chest area of the dress was too large for L.T., Sciabica helped position L.T.’s breasts appropriately over the built-in padding to achieve the proper fit—all under the direct supervision and with the explicit approval of Wendi Turturici.
63. When L.T. expressed minor embarrassment about the fitting process, her mother immediately dismissed her concerns, stating bluntly: “Oh shut up [L.T.]. Who cares? They're tits!” This crude dismissal by L.T.’s own mother demonstrates the casual attitude toward physical contact and body-related discussions that was normal in their household.

64. This dress fitting incident is crucial context for understanding the innocent nature of the March 13, 2024 school hallway interaction that has been so deliberately and maliciously distorted by Defendants.

The March 13, 2024 School Hallway Incident

65. On March 13, 2024, during normal school hours and in full view of other teachers and students, Sciabica encountered L.T. in the hallway at Marlboro Memorial Middle School.

66. The interaction occurred in the middle of the school day with multiple witnesses present, including teacher Michaela Weir and several students who were transitioning between classes.

67. Sciabica engaged L.T. in brief, friendly conversation, asking about her health (as L.T. had been ill during the previous week) and inquiring about a shirt that Sciabica had previously given to L.T.

68. As part of this innocent conversation, Sciabica gently felt L.T.'s forehead to check for fever, demonstrating the caring, maternal concern that had characterized their relationship for years.

69. Sciabica then made a playful reference to the dress fitting that had occurred the previous week, asking "What did mom decide. How are we getting these boobalás in the dress?" while lightly tapping L.T.'s upper chest area twice with her fingertips.

70. The entire physical contact lasted no more than a second or two and was clearly referential to the dress fitting that had occurred with Wendi Turturici's knowledge and participation just one week earlier.

71. L.T.'s reaction to this interaction was entirely positive—she giggled, stomped her feet playfully, and continued down the hallway with a smile on her face, displaying none of the distress or discomfort that would be expected if the interaction had been inappropriate or unwelcome.

72. No reasonable person witnessing this brief, contextual interaction could conclude that it was sexual, inappropriate, or harmful in nature. The interaction was consistent with the caring, mentoring relationship that had existed between Sciabica and L.T. for years with parental knowledge and approval.

Michaela Weir's False and Malicious Reporting

73. Despite being positioned approximately two or three feet away from the interaction, with L.T.'s back to her, teacher Michaela Weir was in no position to observe the interaction she claimed to have witnessed.
74. Defendant Weir sought absolutely no clarification of what she observed and gave no indication that she was concerned, alarmed, offended, or that she needed to render any aid or comfort to L.T. In fact, Weir and the Plaintiff each returned to their respective classrooms immediately.
75. Subsequently, Weir falsely reported to police that Sciabica had "groped" L.T.'s breasts using "two hands," a description that is demonstrably and wildly false, and completely contradicted by available security footage.
76. Weir's false characterization of the incident was motivated by personal animus toward Sciabica.
77. Weir's false statements to law enforcement constitute defamation *per se* and have directly contributed to the destruction of Sciabica's life and livelihood.

Immediate Aftermath and L.T.'s Normal Behavior

78. Following the March 13, 2024, hallway interaction, L.T. continued her normal school activities without any indication of distress, discomfort, or concern about the encounter with Sciabica.
79. L.T. attended her regular classes, participated in school activities, and interacted normally with teachers and classmates, demonstrating that she was not traumatized or harmed by the brief interaction.
80. At no point did L.T. report feeling uncomfortable or violated by the interaction, nor did she seek support from school counselors or other staff members.
81. The absence of any immediate distress or behavioral changes in L.T. following the interaction provides strong evidence that the encounter was perceived as innocent and harmless by the alleged "victim" herself.

The School District's Due Process Violations

82. Rather than conducting a thorough, fair investigation into the allegations against Sciabica, Defendants immediately presumed her guilt and took drastic disciplinary action without affording her Constitutionally protected due process rights.
83. Defendant Ballone, in his Official Capacity as Superintendent of Marlboro Township Public Schools, perpetuated Defendant Weir's false accusations and used these lies as the basis to force Plaintiff to resign from her position as a special education teacher.
84. Defendant Ballone also withheld the video of the interaction from Plaintiff, despite the video clearly contradicting the statements given to Ballone by Defendant Weir, L.T., and others.
85. Ms. Sciabica was suspended with pay pending investigation, depriving her of her ability to work and earn future income under normal conditions without Constitutionally mandated justification or procedural safeguards.
86. Defendants failed to provide Sciabica with requisite notice of the specific charges against her, the evidence supporting those charges, or her right to representation during the investigation process.
87. Defendants never informed Plaintiff of any investigation launched against her.
88. Defendants refused to show Plaintiff the video of the incident which occurred on March 13, 2024, until August 31, 2024, more than five-and-a-half months after the fact, despite Plaintiff's repeated verbal demands. Plaintiff's then attorney made timely demands, but he was not permitted to review the video until May 9, 2024.
89. Defendants then leveled tenure charges against Plaintiff on May 13, 2024, which was no more than a wholesale adaptation of the allegations contained in the Turturicis' civil complaint against the Plaintiff and various municipal defendants filed in New Jersey Superior Court, Monmouth County under Docket No. MON-L-1452-24.
90. Whatever investigation conducted by Defendants was cursory, biased, and designed to reach a predetermined conclusion rather than to ascertain the truth of the allegations.

91. Defendants pressured Sciabica to resign under circumstances that were coercive and fundamentally unfair, threatening even more severe consequences if she refused to comply.
92. Sciabica's forced resignation was obtained by duress and without legal representation, rendering it invalid and constituting a constructive termination in violation of her Constitutional and contractual rights.

Transmission of False Information to State Authorities

93. Following Sciabica's forced resignation, Defendants transmitted false and stigmatizing information about her to the New Jersey State Board of Examiners and other state authorities.
94. These transmissions contained materially false statements about the nature of the allegations against Sciabica and failed to include exculpatory evidence that would have supported her innocence.
95. The transmission of this false information resulted in administrative proceedings that threatened Sciabica's teaching certification and pension benefits.
96. Defendants' actions in transmitting false information to state authorities constitute additional violations of Sciabica's due process rights and caused harm to her professional standing and financial security.

Defamation

97. Following the Turturicis' initiation of legal proceedings against the school district, the Turturicis and their attorney, Nima Ameri, orchestrated a campaign of public defamation designed to destroy Sciabica's reputation and maximize pressure for a financial settlement.
98. Wendi and Salvatore Turturici appeared at Township school board meetings and made false, inflammatory statements about Sciabica, mischaracterizing the innocent hallway interaction as a serious sexual assault and demanded millions of dollars in damages.
99. Ameri also appeared on the "The Crime Fix with Angenette Levy" podcast, making false and defamatory statements about Sciabica to the audience and further spreading lies about Plaintiff's character and conduct.

100. These public statements by Ameri were made with actual malice and with reckless disregard for their truth or falsity, causing substantial damage to Sciabica's reputation in the community and beyond.

Community-Wide Defamation and Social Media Campaign

101. Following the public statements by Ameri and others, multiple individuals engaged in a campaign of defamation against Sciabica across various social media platforms and in community fora.

102. Defendants Angela Boyd McNicholas, Evelyn Arminio Bilotti, Carolina Scalici, Ereny Phillips Tadros, Michelle Stoylar, Nicole Stouffer, Susan Rae Gleeson, Bonnie Gabizon, Laurie Swanson, Rita Ienco Plaza, Nicole Gwasda, and Irene Dekhterman participated in the mobbing by posting false and defamatory content about Sciabica on Facebook, Instagram, and other social media platforms.

103. These defendants falsely branded Sciabica as a "predator," "groomer," "pedophile," and other deeply offensive terms, causing severe and lasting damage to her reputation.

104. The defamatory content posted by these defendants was viewed by thousands of individuals in the local community and beyond, exponentially amplifying the harm to Sciabica's reputation and jeopardizing her safety while she continued to live and work in the area.

105. Sciabica attempted to move due to these threats and hostile conditions, but she could not afford to do so. See ¶¶ 112-114, *infra*.

106. Many of these defendants had no personal knowledge of the events in question but participated in the mobbing of the Plaintiff based upon false information propagated by others, demonstrating the reckless and malicious nature of the mobbing.

107. Defendant Nicole Tropiano, in or about early August 2025 (nine months after Sciabica was acquitted at her criminal trial), defamed the Plaintiff by publishing to multiple third parties at a social gathering, "I know Jenna Sciabica, she molested my best friend's daughter!"

Psychological and Emotional Harm

108. The Plaintiff, as a direct result of the torrent of Defendants' abuse, was caused to be admitted to the psychiatric ward of a hospital and released after a judicial hearing, and on another occasion, was treated and released from the psychiatric emergency room of a hospital, and has been obligated for mental health services including but not being limited to intensive therapies and medications, with treatment still ongoing.

Economic Harm and Employment Violations

109. As a direct result of Defendants' conduct, Sciabica suffered and continues to suffer devastating economic losses, including the loss of her salary, benefits, pension contributions, and future earning capacity.

110. Defendants violated New Jersey wage payment laws by withholding Sciabica's earned salary without legal justification, causing her immediate financial hardship during an already difficult period following Anthony's death.

111. Defendants Michael J. Gross, Esq., Christine Jelinsky and Vincent Caravello made false representations to unemployment authorities on at least three occasions that resulted in the denial of Sciabica's unemployment benefits, further exacerbating her financial distress.

112. The destruction of Sciabica's reputation has made it impossible for her to secure alternative employment as a teacher, effectively ending a career that spanned more than a decade and a half.

Physical Threats and Safety Concerns

113. The widespread defamation campaign against Sciabica resulted in credible threats to her physical safety requiring police intervention and causing her to live in fear for her personal safety and security.

114. Sciabica received and continues to receive threatening communications from unknown individuals who are clearly influenced by the false and inflammatory statements propagated by the Defendants.

115. The threats against Sciabica were sufficiently credible, including but not being limited to two bomb threats to her home, that warranted law enforcement response and forced the Plaintiff to alter her daily activities and living arrangements to protect her safety.

Insurance Coverage Violations

116. Despite having valid insurance coverage through State Farm Fire and Casualty Company and Republic-Franklin Insurance Company, both insurers have wrongfully denied coverage for the claims and litigation arising from the false allegations against Sciabica.

117. Both insurance companies have clear contractual obligations to defend and indemnify Sciabica against the types of claims alleged in this case, yet they have refused to honor these obligations.

118. The insurance companies' denial of coverage constitutes bad faith and breach of contract, leaving Sciabica to bear the substantial costs of defending herself against false accusations without the protection she paid for and was entitled to receive.

COUNT ONE

42 U.S.C. § 1983 – *Monell* Liability

As Against Marlboro Township Public Schools, Michael Ballone, John Pacifico, Loreen Labuza, Michael J. Gross, Esq., Vincent Caravello, and Christine Jelinsky in their Official Capacities. (Collectively, “School District Defendants”)

119. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.

120. School District Defendants owed Plaintiff Constitutionally guaranteed minimum procedural protections before depriving her of her substantive due process rights.

121. Defendants, acting under color of state law, deprived Sciabica of her procedural and substantive due process rights by forcing her resignation based on fabricated allegations without proper investigation or due process procedures.

122. Defendants' actions were arbitrary, capricious, and conscience-shocking, violating Sciabica's Fourteenth Amendment rights.

123. At all relevant times, Defendant Marlboro Township Public Schools was a public entity acting under color of state law.

124. At all relevant times, Michael Ballone, John Pacifico, Loreen Labuza, Michael J. Gross, Esq., Vincent Caravello, and Christine Jelinsky were employees of Marlboro Township Public Schools acting under color of state law.
125. Defendants Pacifico and Ballone, in their official capacities as Principal and Superintendent, were final policymakers for Marlboro Schools with respect to disciplinary decisions, suspensions, resignations, and communications to licensing authorities. Their actions therefore constitute official policy attributable to the municipal defendants.
126. The Constitutional violations suffered by Plaintiff were the direct and proximate result of the policies, customs, and practices of Marlboro Township Public Schools and Marlboro Memorial Middle School, including but not limited to:
- a. A custom of disciplining employees without due process or meaningful investigation;
 - b. A policy of transmitting stigmatizing accusations to licensing authorities without substantiation;
 - c. A failure to train and supervise administrators regarding the Constitutional rights of employees; and
 - d. A deliberate indifference to the reputational and property interests of employees when responding to complaints.
127. By reason of these policies and customs, Defendants deprived Plaintiff of her rights secured by the Constitution of the United States, including her liberty and property interests in her tenured employment, her reputation, and her ability to pursue her chosen occupation.
128. Defendants' actions were taken intentionally and/or with deliberate indifference to Plaintiff's Constitutional rights and were the moving force behind her loss of employment, impairment of her license and pension, and reputational harm.

COUNT TWO

**42 U.S.C. § 1983 – “Stigma-Plus” Liability
Deprivation of Civil Rights – Violation of Procedural Due Process Under
the Fourteenth Amendment
(As Against School District Defendants)**

129. In addition, Defendants’ actions constituted a “stigma-plus” violation of Plaintiff’s liberty interests under the Fourteenth Amendment.
130. Acting under color of state law, Defendants publicly and falsely accused Plaintiff of professional misconduct and moral unfitness in connection with her employment, disseminating those stigmatizing charges to third parties, including within the school community, law enforcement, and to state licensing authorities.
131. These defamatory statements were made in conjunction with and as the basis for a tangible alteration of Plaintiff’s legal status, namely the coerced resignation, loss of her tenured employment, and resulting scrutiny of her teaching certification, losses in contributions to her pension rights, and impairment of future employment.
132. This was all done without providing Plaintiff notice or a meaningful opportunity to be heard. The combination of reputational harm and adverse employment action deprived Plaintiff of a protected liberty interest without due process of law, in violation of 42 U.S.C. § 1983.

COUNT THREE

**42 U.S.C. § 1983 – *Monell* Liability
As Against Pasquale Menna, in his Official Capacity as Marlboro Municipal Prosecutor,
The Township of Marlboro, John Does Nos. 1-10 and Jane Roes Nos. 1-10 are Currently Unknown
and Unnamed Individuals Employed by the Township of Marlboro.
(Collectively, “Police Defendants”)**

133. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.
134. Defendants, acting under color of state law, deprived Sciabica of her procedural and substantive due process rights by violating Plaintiff’s Constitutional right to privacy.
135. At all relevant times, Defendant Pasquale Menna was employed by Marlboro Township as a Municipal Prosecutor.

136. Defendant Menna exercised his final decision-making authority to direct employees of the Marlboro Police Department by instructing employees of the Township of Marlboro, specifically the Marlboro Police Department, to disseminate a CD copy of surveillance video that had been confidentially viewed *in camera* in the criminal trial against Plaintiff.
137. Menna's instruction to disseminate the confidential video caused Plaintiff's Constitutional rights to procedural and substantive due process and privacy to be violated.
138. Defendants' actions were the direct and proximate cause of Plaintiff's damages.
139. Defendants' actions were taken intentionally and/or with deliberate indifference to Plaintiff's Constitutional rights and were the moving force behind the violation of Plaintiff's Constitutional due process rights and right to privacy.

COUNT FOUR
42 U.S.C. § 1983 – Procedural Due Process Violation
As Against Pasquale Menna, in his Individual Capacity

140. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.
141. Defendant Menna acted outside the scope of his prosecutorial duties when, after the trial concluded, he instructed employees of the Marlboro Police Department to disseminate a CD copy of surveillance video that was then confidentially viewed *in camera* in the criminal trial against Plaintiff.
142. This conduct was administrative in nature and not intimately associated with the judicial phase of the criminal process.
143. Defendant Menna's actions caused Plaintiff's Constitutional rights to procedural due process and privacy to be violated.
144. Defendant's actions were taken intentionally and/or with deliberate indifference to Plaintiff's Constitutional rights and were the cause of the violations of those rights.

COUNT FIVE

**N.J. Stat. Ann. § 10:6-2 – New Jersey Civil Rights Act Violations
As Against School District Defendants and Police Defendants**

145. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.
146. Defendants, acting under color of law, deprived Plaintiff of rights secured by the New Jersey Constitution, including her rights to procedural and substantive due process in violation of N.J. Stat. Ann. § 10:6-2.
147. These deprivations mirror and supplement the violations of the United States Constitution alleged in Counts One through Four and are independently actionable under the NJCRA.

COUNT SIX

Defamation

Wendi Turturici, Salvatore Turturici, Nicole Stouffer, Angela Boyd McNicholas, Evelyn Arminio Bilotti, Carolina Scalici, Ereny Phillips Tadros, Michelle Stoylar, Susan Rae Gleeson, Bonnie Gabizon, Laurie Swanson, Rita Ienco Plaza, Nicole Gwasda, Irene Dekhterman, Nima Ameri, Esq., Nicole Tropiano, Gary Smiley, and Mark Henley

148. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.
149. Defendants published false and defamatory statements about Sciabica, damaging her reputation and causing severe economic and emotional harm.

COUNT SEVEN

Intentional Infliction of Emotional Distress

Wendi Turturici, Salvatore Turturici, Nicole Stouffer, Angela Boyd McNicholas, Evelyn Arminio Bilotti, Carolina Scalici, Ereny Phillips Tadros, Michelle Stoylar, Susan Rae Gleeson, Bonnie Gabizon, Laurie Swanson, Rita Ienco Plaza, Nicole Gwasda, Irene Dekhterman, Nima Ameri, Esq., Nicole Tropiano, Gary Smiley, and Mark Henley

150. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.
151. Defendants made egregious statements that were so outrageous in character, and so extreme in degree, as to go beyond all possible bounds in decency and to be regarded as atrocious and utterly intolerable in a civilized community.
152. Moreover, all statements were patently false, and Defendants knew they were false.
153. These statements were made verbally and in writing, and across various platforms.

154. Defendants' extreme and outrageous conduct intentionally caused Sciabica severe emotional distress through their coordinated campaign of false accusations and public defamation.

COUNT EIGHT
Breach of Contract
As Against School District Defendants

155. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.

156. Defendants breached their employment contract with Sciabica by failing to provide due process, wrongfully forcing her resignation, and withholding earned wages and benefits.

COUNT NINE
Violation of New Jersey Wage Payment Law
As Against School District Defendants

157. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.

158. Defendants violated New Jersey wage payment laws by withholding Ms. Sciabica's earned salary and benefits without legal justification.

COUNT TEN
Constructive Termination
As Against School District Defendants

159. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.

160. Defendants created intolerable working conditions through false accusations and public defamation, forcing Sciabica's constructive termination.

COUNT ELEVEN
Bad Faith Denial of Insurance Coverage
As Against State Farm and Republic-Franklin

161. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.

162. Insurance Defendants wrongfully denied coverage in bad faith despite clear contractual obligations to defend and indemnify Sciabica.

COUNT TWELVE
Breach of Insurance Contract
Against State Farm and Republic-Franklin

163. Plaintiff incorporates all preceding allegations.
164. Insurance Defendants breached their contractual obligations by refusing to provide defense and indemnification coverage as required under their policies.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff demands judgment in her favor and against the Defendants as follows:

AS TO COUNT ONE
42 U.S.C. § 1983 – Monell Liability
As Against the School District Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages in an amount to be determined at trial for economic losses, lost wages and benefits, loss of tenure, pension impairment, reputational injury, emotional distress, and pain and suffering proximately caused by Defendants' conduct;
- B. Front pay and back pay for all salary, wages, and benefits wrongfully withheld;
- C. Restoration of pension credits and employment benefits wrongfully diminished or denied;
- D. Declaratory relief adjudging that Defendants violated Plaintiff's procedural and substantive due-process rights under the United States Constitution;
- E. Attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1988; and
- F. Such other and further relief as the Court deems just, proper, and equitable.

AS TO COUNT TWO
42 U.S.C. § 1983 – “Stigma-Plus” Liability
As Against the School District Defendants

- A. A declaratory judgment that Defendants violated Plaintiff's Fourteenth Amendment liberty interests by publicly disseminating false, stigmatizing accusations in connection with her coerced resignation;
- B. An injunction ordering Defendants to provide Plaintiff with a name-clearing hearing and to remove or retract all stigmatizing statements from her employment and licensing records;

- C. Compensatory damages for reputational injury, loss of professional standing, emotional distress, and other harms proximately caused by the constitutional violation;
- D. Punitive damages against all individual Defendants whose conduct was willful, wanton, malicious, or undertaken with reckless disregard for Plaintiff's rights; and
- E. Attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1988.

AS TO COUNT THREE
42 U.S.C. § 1983 – Monell Liability/Privacy Violation
As Against the Police Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages for the violation of Plaintiff's constitutional right to privacy and due process, including reputational, emotional, and economic injury;
- B. Declaratory relief adjudging that Defendants' policies and actions violated Plaintiff's constitutional rights;
- C. Punitive damages against any individual actors whose conduct was intentional, willful, or reckless;
- D. Attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1988; and
- E. Such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.

AS TO COUNT FOUR
42 U.S.C. § 1983 – Procedural Due Process Violation
As Against Pasquale Menna, Individually

- A. Compensatory damages for the deprivation of Plaintiff's procedural-due-process and privacy rights;
- B. Punitive damages for willful and malicious conduct outside the scope of prosecutorial immunity;
- C. Declaratory relief adjudging that Defendant violated Plaintiff's constitutional rights; and
- D. Attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1988.

AS TO COUNT FIVE
N.J. Stat. Ann. § 10:6-2 – New Jersey Civil Rights Act
As Against the School District Defendants and Police Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages for violations of Plaintiff's rights to due process and privacy under the New Jersey Constitution;
- B. Punitive damages as permitted by statute;
- C. Declaratory and injunctive relief enjoining Defendants from further constitutional violations;
- D. Treble damages and attorneys' fees pursuant to N.J. Stat. Ann. § 10:6-2(f); and
- E. Such other relief as the Court deems equitable and just.

AS TO COUNT SIX
Defamation
As Against the Individual Civilian Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages for reputational injury, emotional distress, and economic losses caused by false and defamatory statements;
- B. Punitive damages for willful and malicious conduct;
- C. Injunctive relief requiring retraction of defamatory publications and cessation of further defamatory conduct; and
- D. Such other relief as the Court deems just and proper.

AS TO COUNT SEVEN
Intentional Infliction of Emotional Distress
As Against the Individual Civilian Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages for severe emotional distress, humiliation, and reputational harm;
- B. Punitive damages for outrageous and reckless conduct; and
- C. Pre- and post-judgment interest and such other relief as the Court deems just.

AS TO COUNT EIGHT
Breach of Contract
As Against the School District Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages for unpaid salary, lost benefits, and restoration of pension credits;
- B. Front and back pay for all wages wrongfully withheld;

- C. Attorneys' fees and costs as permitted by law; and
- D. Such equitable and declaratory relief as the Court deems appropriate.

AS TO COUNT NINE
Violation of New Jersey Wage Payment Law
As Against the School District Defendants

- A. Liquidated and statutory damages for unpaid wages, salary, and benefits;
- B. Treble damages and attorneys' fees as authorized by statute; and
- C. Such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.

AS TO COUNT TEN
Constructive Termination
As Against the School District Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages for lost wages, front pay, emotional distress, and reputational harm; and
- B. All other equitable relief necessary to make Plaintiff whole.

AS TO COUNT ELEVEN
Bad Faith Denial of Insurance Coverage
As Against the Insurance Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages for breach of the duty to defend and indemnify;
- B. Punitive damages for bad-faith denial of coverage;
- C. Declaratory relief compelling Defendants to defend and indemnify Plaintiff under their respective policies; and
- D. Attorneys' fees, costs, and reimbursement of all defense expenses incurred.

AS TO COUNT TWELVE
Breach of Insurance Contract
As Against the Insurance Defendants

- A. Compensatory damages for breach of contract;
- B. Declaratory relief enforcing their duty to defend and indemnify;
- C. Pre- and post-judgment interest; and
- D. Attorneys' fees and costs incurred in enforcing coverage obligations.

JURY DEMAND

Plaintiff demands a trial by jury on all issues subject to trial.



The JS 44 civil cover sheet and the information contained herein neither replaces nor supplements the filings and service of pleading or other papers as required by law, except as provided by local rules of court. If the plaintiff or defendant is a government agency, use only the full name or standard abbreviations. - (b) County of Residence.** For each civil case filed, except U.S. plaintiff cases, enter the name of the county where the first listed plaintiff resides at the time of filing.
